

Limited Area Access Application Instructions for Hunters

If you qualify to hunt in The Limited Access Area you must request access and undergo a “Reliability and Trustworthiness” evaluation as required by Army regulation and local policy.

(AR 190-11 2-11 and CN CPL 25)

Military and Department of Defense (DoD) personnel with security clearance

- Submit Request for Limited Area Access Form 19B
- Complete the form electronically to maintain legibility
- Submit the completed form to the Camp Navajo Hunting Program Coordinator no later than Thirty (30) days prior to your hunt
- Submission via e-mail is preferred but the form can be mailed
- Indicate that you have a security clearance, SECRET or above, where required
- If your Security Management Office (SMO) (S2) uses JPAS there is no need to attach written clearance verification
- If your SMO does NOT use JPAS please attach written verification of your clearance from your SMO
- Please ensure that the form is filled completely before submission

Military and DoD retirees without security clearance

- Submit Request for Limited Area Access Form 19B
- Complete the form electronically to maintain legibility
- In the organization section indicate that you are a retiree, no further information is required in that section
- Leave blank the supervisor/manager section
- Submit the completed form to the Camp Navajo Hunting Program Coordinator no later than Thirty (30) days prior to your hunt
- Submission via e-mail is preferred but the form can be mailed
- Please ensure that the form is filled completely before submission
- Contact ACCUSEARCH at (800) 462-7019
- Request a nationwide criminal check for Camp Navajo
- The current cost to the hunter is about \$35.00 but is subject to change without notice
- Ensure that ACCUSEARCH send the results directly to the Camp Navajo Command Security Manager at Wally.Handley@azdema.gov
