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AREA OF CONSIDERATION: This position is the Active Guard and Reserve Force and is **open to current members of the (All Units), Arizona Air National Guard.** Individual selected will receive an Active Duty Title 32 Tour with the Arizona Air National Guard. In order to be considered for this position applicants must meet minimum qualifications. **PCS funds are authorized.**

- **Current Report of Individual Personnel (RIP). RIP can be obtained from the servicing Military Personnel Flight (MPF). In lieu of a RIP, applicant may provide a printout from the Virtual MPF (vMPF). Select 'Record Review' and then 'Print/View All Pages'. For Enlisted Members, documents MUST show your ASVAB scores.**
- **Copy of current Fitness Test scores, if exemptions exist please include the AF 469. Must be within 12 months.**
- **Copy of AF Form 422, Physical Profile Serial Report and AF Form 1042 (for flight status), Flight Physical. (Both forms must be current within 12 months) This form can be obtained from your Wing Clinic.**

NATIONAL GUARD REQUIREMENTS:

1. Must be in compliance with physical fitness, height, weight, and body fat measurement standards as listed in AFI 36-2905.
2. You must have completed a medical examination in accordance with AFI 48-123 within the 12 months preceding your entry into the AGR program. Women will be tested for pregnancy before entering the AGR program. HIV must be current within 6 months.
3. If required, we will initiate an investigation for a security clearance. Unfavorable results will be cause for your immediate separation.
4. Individuals selected for AGR tours who cannot obtain 20 years of Active Federal Service prior to reaching mandatory retirement, age 60 for enlisted personnel, or mandatory separation date for officers and those within their first 24 months of an AGR assignment or reassignment must submit a waiver request through the HRO remote to the HRO for Waiver for Exceptional Circumstances prior to the closing date of this announcement. Waivers must justify why request is in the best interest of the unit, State, or Air National Guard.
5. You must meet eligibility requirements of AFI36-2101 Classifying Military Personnel (Officer and Enlisted) and ANGI 36-101 (The Active Guard/Reserve Program).
6. AGRs will not be reassigned during the first 24 months of their initial tour or within the first 24 months of reassignment, except in the event of an approved waiver from the Human Resource Officer prior to announcement closing date.
7. Applicants for E-8 positions must have the ability to complete Senior Noncommissioned Officer Academy within 36 months of assignment IAW para 2.23.1 of ANGI 36-2101.
8. Individuals selected for Control Grade positions must meet requirement as stated in ANGI 36-101.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES REQUIRED FOR SUCCESSFUL PERFORMANCE IN THIS POSITION:
Each applicant should fully justify on their application how they meet each KSA listed below using AZNG Form 335-2-R to reference the justification.

1. Knowledge of the Air Force publication, distribution and file documentation procedures to include storage and distribution of records and files.
2. Knowledge of and ability to operate various types of office equipment and computer systems to produce products, type forms, and prepare correspondence and other documents.
3. Knowledge of Air Force directives pertaining to forms management and human resources management, includes - promotions, manning documents, reenlistments, extensions, evals, leave, training, reports
4. Knowledge of executive support, includes protocol, postal/mail functions, calendar management, and fitness program
5. Analytical skill and judgment as well as knowledge of the mission of the wing and other units serviced.
6. Ability to analyze information, to determine its relevance and to provide options to management/supervisors/military members regarding appropriate course of action.
7. Ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing.

SPECIALIZED EXPERIENCE: Must have 12 months experience establishing and retrieving files and information; experience typing memos, letters and records with responsibility for proofreading, punctuation, grammar, etc., experience in the performance of general office work, i.e., answering telephone, receiving and distributing mail and maintaining records; experience following oral and written instructions to accomplish work; experience providing routine information both orally and in writing.

BRIEF JOB DESCRIPTION: This position is located within the Operations Group of the 161st Air Refueling Wing. Its primary purpose is to serve as the focal point, local authority and expert source for information in providing a wide variety of orderly room/administrative support for the organization. These support responsibilities are comprised of the following type of duties: Serves as the focal point, local authority and expert source for information for all administrative functions of the unit. These functions include correspondence and messages; records documentation management; printing and duplication; publication and forms management; reference library; special orders; receipt, storage and control of classified documents; on the job training programs for both technicians and unit military personnel; work includes, force management, officer performance reports, training requirements, awards and decorations; inspecting administrative files, publications and procedures in other functional areas; managing the

preparation, publication, distribution and tracking of civilian and military travel orders; annual training, special training, and other orders, to include special authorizations and reconciles the orders process with the workday accounting program to ensure validation of orders requirements; performing and directing the preparation, distribution and accounting of all schedules, directives, maintenance orders, procedures, passports and summaries; and monitoring a correspondence and reports suspense system. As Work Group Administrator provides technical support and troubleshooting for daily network operations including identifying issues and resolving problems, and documenting the problem history and solution. Records trends and problems for resolution by the incumbent or other network specialist. Explains complex network concepts to non-technical personnel in non-technical language. Installs and configures application software to run on stand-alone computers or networked systems for networked "commercial off the shelf" (COTS) software, government owned systems, and client/server networked operation systems (data set/file maintenance, established end-user client software).
