AREA OF CONSIDERATION: This position is in the Active Guard and Reserve Force and is open to current Federally Recognized Commissioned Warrant Officers in the grades of CW2 through CW3 who are members of the Arizona Army National Guard or eligible to become a member of the Arizona Army National Guard. Individual selected will receive an Active Duty Title 32 Tour with the Arizona Army National Guard. In order to be considered for this position, applicants must meet minimum qualifications as outlined on the reverse of this announcement.

NOTE: Selection for this position requires declaration of Arizona state residency at the time of in-processing, and maintaining that residency while on AGR status under Title 32, USC.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLYING: IAW NGR 600-5, paragraph 2-4, the documents listed **WILL** be submitted "AS A MINIMUM". If any of the required documents are not reasonably available to you, a brief letter will be submitted citing the documents missing with a short explanation necessary to certify the soldier as eligible. **Failure to do so may result in a finding of ineligibility and may cause the applicant to lose consideration for this position.**

POSITION COMPATIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

The individual(s) must be a member of the Arizona (ARMY) National Guard or eligible to become a member of the Arizona Army National Guard and qualify for and be placed in the following compatible MOS/AOC: 153DC

APPOINTMENT REQUIREMENTS:

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1. Must be a current or eligible to become a member of the Arizona Army National Guard
 2. Must meet the medical fitness standards for retention per AR 40-501, chapter 3.
 3. Soldiers must meet body composition standards prescribed in AR 600-9.
 4. Must be branch qualified for the position.
 5. ARNG applicants must be able to serve at least 3 years in AGR status prior to completing 18 years of Active Service or mandatory removal from active service based on age or service (without any extensions) under any provision of law or regulation as prescribed by current directives.
 6. AGR officers will not be reassigned during the first 18 months of their initial tour, except in the event of mobilization or force structure changes.
 7. Must not be eligible for, or receiving a Federal retirement annuity.
 8. Must possess a security clearance required grade, AOC and AGR Position.
 9. Permanent Change of Station (PCS) expenses may be authorized for this position. Authorization of payment of PCS expenses will be granted only after a determination is made that PCS is in the best interest of the Arizona Army National Guard and upon availability of funds from the National Guard Bureau.
 10. Additional qualification requirements are outlined in NGR 600-5, AR 135-18 and other applicable regulations and laws governing the Active Guard/Reserve Program.
 11. Must not be flagged in SIDPERS for weight, APFT, security violations or pending any adverse actions.
 12. Individuals will not be considered eligible for AGR tours that cannot obtain 20 years of Active Federal Service (AFS) prior to reaching mandatory separation. Applicants for limited AGR service must complete a statement of understanding and obtain prior waiver approval by TAG.
 13. Applicants who answer YES to questions 8, or 12-18 of section IV, NGB Form 34-1, or have not completed Initial entry training (IET) are ineligible to apply. to include DD214(s) that have unfavorable remarks to include; unsatisfactory Performance, Misconduct, Dropped from the Rolls (DRF) Unsuitability/Unfitness or in lieu of court-martial AR 135-18, AR 135-91 Chapter 4,26, AR 135-178 Chapter 8,3 and 635-200 Chapter11.
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KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES REQUIRED FOR SUCCESSFUL PERFORMANCE IN THIS POSITION OR THE MOS PREREQUISITES:

1. Skill in written and oral communications.
 2. Knowledge of flight operations in the national airspace system.
 3. Knowledge of radio procedures and phraseology.
 4. Knowledge of Fundamentals of Instruction.
 5. Ability to evaluate and determine training requirements.
 6. Ability to train and certify proficiency and competency of pilots and flight instructors.
 7. Knowledge of the UH-60 A/L and its operations.
 8. Knowledge of the FM 3-04.203, TC 3-04.11, and TC 3-04.33.
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BRIEF JOB DESCRIPTION Trains and evaluates aviators in the basic and advanced maneuvers in Army aircraft. Trains aviators in preflight, normal and emergency procedures, aircraft systems in: the actual aircraft, the flight simulator, and in the classroom environment. Trains and evaluates aviators in performance and technical mission tasks to include unaided night, night vision system, terrain flight, and instrument flight procedures. Develops new programs as required in accordance with procedural and doctrinal changes. Drafts implementing instructions and procedures for section use following issuance of new or changed policies, regulations and procedures. Maintains training records on assigned crewmembers and recommends administrative action and completion of training. Incumbent is subject to uncommon tours of duty with rotational shift assignments. Incumbent is required to fly military aircraft. Incumbent will be required to become ABIC qualified for platform instruction. Incumbent is subject to additional duties assigned by the Command.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Must be Instructor Pilot qualified in the UH-60A/L.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS: A rated Army Aviator qualified as an Instructor Pilot in the UH-60A/L/M. Effective oral communication skills needed to conduct briefings and lectures on flight subjects. Qualifications as an instrument examiner are desirable.
