AREA OF CONSIDERATION:

This position is in the Federal/Excepted Civil Service and is **open to current members and those eligible for membership in the Arizona Air National Guard.** Individual selected will receive an **Indefinite Appointment** and may be converted to permanent based on availability of funds or position no longer being encumbered. Acceptance of a Federal Excepted technician position of over 179 days in length will cause termination from the Selected Reserve Incentive Program (BONUS). Individual selected will require a military medical records screening if applicable, to be completed prior to appointment, and/or may be required to take a pre-employment medical screening examination dependent on the position type and military medical records screening results.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLYING: Individuals applying for vacancies with the Arizona National Guard may submit Optional Form 612 (Optional Application for Federal Employment), or a Resume. Application documents must contain the Announcement Number, Title and Grade(s) of the job being applied for. Personal information must include full name and address (including ZIP Code), Day and evening phone numbers (with area code). Work experience information should be limited to either paid or nonpaid experience directly related to the position that the individual is applying for and must include: Job Title, Duties and accomplishments, Employers name and address, Supervisors name and phone number, starting and ending dates, hours per week and salary.

Applications will be evaluated solely on information supplied in the application (OF 612) or resume. KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES REQUIRED FOR SUCCESSFUL PERFORMANCE IN THIS POSITION:

Each applicant should fully justify on their application how they meet each KSA listed below using AZNG Form 335-2-R to reference the justification.

1. Ability to perform, inspection, functional check, and preventive maintenance on aircraft to include periodic, phase, hourly, preflight, postflight, thruflight, calendar and special inspections such as fuel contamination, emergency equipment and oil sampling, functional checks such as landing gear retraction, operational checks on hydraulic, electrical, pressurization and lubrication.
2. Ability to launch and Recover assigned and transient aircraft. Troubleshoots and performs unscheduled maintenance on assigned and transient aircraft, utilizing various gauges, meters, measuring devices and other related test equipment. Removes and replaces aircraft components such as landing gear mechanisms, wheels, brakes, tires and inoperative parts and elements.
3. Ability to service and inspect for conditions such as oil, fluid, fuel, hydraulic and oxygen systems leaks; damaged tires; and loose panels which would make the aircraft unsafe for flight. Instructs, directs, and assigns maintenance repair tasks to Drill Status Guard Members. Observes work and ensures compliance with standard procedures and applicable technical publications.
4. Ability to provide data for aircraft maintenance historical records, complete maintenance data collection for aircraft history and other forms as required. Assists the aircraft maintenance supply function in identifying parts and stock numbers and obtaining necessary parts and tools to perform assigned duties.
5. Ability to prepare for and participate in various types of readiness evaluations such as ORI, MST, IG and UE Inspections, Mobility and Command Support Exercises.

SPECIALIZED EXPERIENCE: Must possess at least 18 months of experience or training installing, adjusting, aligning, troubleshooting and functionally testing the various major and minor mechanical and pneumatic systems on an aircraft during overhaul or modification. Experience coordinating the work of other mechanics, and scheduling maintenance to ensure completion of critical actions and optimum workflow.

BRIEF JOB DESCRIPTION: This position is located at the 161st Air Refueling Wing, Phoenix, Arizona. Its primary purpose is to inspect, repair, modify, and service aircraft systems, components, and assemblies, both on- and off-aircraft. This position is located within a National Guard aircraft maintenance organization. Performs inspections, functional checks, and preventive maintenance on aircraft to include periodic, phase, hourly, preflight, postflight, calendar, thru-flight, and special inspections such as fuel contamination, emergency equipment, and oil sampling. Troubleshoots and performs unscheduled maintenance on assigned and transient aircraft, utilizing various gauges, meters, measuring devices and other related test equipment. Performs major adjustments and alignments of aircraft systems or components and assists specialists as required. May be required to perform user and organizational level maintenance on assigned support equipment, including inspection, repair, modification, and corrosion prevention. Inventories, controls, stores and repairs 780 equipment. Provides data for aircraft maintenance historical records, complete maintenance data collection, man-hour accounting, and other forms as required. Assists the aircraft maintenance supply function in identifying parts and stock numbers and obtaining necessary parts and tools to perform assigned duties. Instructs, directs, and assigns maintenance repair tasks to drill status guard members. Complies with safety, fire, security, and housekeeping regulations. Prepares for and participates in various types of readiness evaluations such as MEI, ORI, IG and UE inspections, mobility and command support exercises. Performs other duties as assigned. Works under General Supervision. Assignments are given in the form of work orders, inspections reports or verbal instruction. Determines type and extent of repair needed, plans work sequences, selects tools and repair parts and otherwise carries assignments through to completion, with little or no check during progress. Guidelines include technical orders and manuals, manufactures specifications, factory engineering bulletins, and standard operating procedures. May direct the work of one or two lower grade mechanics when assigned to support equipment.
