Must be a current member of the AZ National Guard within the grade(s) of E6 and E7.

AREA OF CONSIDERATION: This position is **open to the grades of: E6 to E7**. Individual selected will receive an AGR Tour with the Arizona Army National Guard. In order to be considered for this position's applicants must meet minimum qualifications as outlined on this announcement.

If any of the required documents are not reasonably available to you, a brief letter will be submitted citing the documents missing with a short explanation necessary to certify the soldier as eligible. Failure to do so may result in a finding of ineligibility and may cause the applicant to lose consideration for this position. Applications must be submitted following the instructions on this announcement. Applications are accepted through FTSMCS, please see FTSMCS INSTRUCTIONS located on DEMA website. KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES REQUIRED FOR SUCCESSFUL PERFORMANCE IN THIS POSITION:

1. Must be 15T MOS Qualified
 2. Qualifying scores 15T: (1) Must be able to receive proponent waiver if not currently 15-series MOS; (2) Current Flight Physical (DD 2992), able to obtain/maintain a class 3 flight physical; cleared to perform flight duties; (3) Qualifying scores for 15T: (a) A physical demands rating of VERY HEAVY – LIFT OCCASIONAL OVER (4) Physical demands rating of VERY HEAVY - LIFT OCCASIONAL OVER 100 LB, FREQUENT 50 LB; (5) A minimum score of 105 in aptitude area MM in Armed Services Vocational aptitude Battery (ASVAB) tests administered prior to 2 January 2002; A minimum score of 102 in aptitude area MM on ASVAB tests administered on and after 2 January 2002. (6) Have knowledge and/or experience in Global Combat Support System – Army (GCSS-A) (7) A minimum physical profile of 222211; (8) Able to obtain/maintain a SECRET clearance;
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APPOINTMENT REQUIREMENTS:

1. Must meet the medical fitness standards for retention per AR 40-501, chapter 3.
2. Soldiers must meet the physical requirements of AR 600-9.
3. ARNG applicants must be able to serve at least 3 years in AGR status prior to completing 18 years of Active Service or mandatory removal from active service based on age or service (without any extensions) under any provision of law or regulation as prescribed by current directives.
4. AGR soldiers will not be reassigned during the first 36 months of their initial tour except in the event of mobilization, force structure changes, or an exception to policy granted by the AGR program manager.
5. Must possess the grade equal to or below that authorized for the AGR duty position.
6. Acceptance of an AGR position TERMINATES entitlements to be Selected Reserve Incentive Program (SRIP).

7. Permanent Change of Station (PCS expenses may be authorized for this position. Authorization of payment of PCS expenses will be granted only after a determination is made that PCS is in the best interest of the Arizona Army National Guard and upon availability of funds from the National Guard Bureau.
 8. Additional qualification requirements are outlined in NGR 600-5, AR 135-18 and other applicable regulations and laws governing the Active Guard/Reserve Program.
 9. Must not be flagged in IPPS-A for weight, APFT, security violations or pending any adverse actions
 10. Applicants who answer "yes" to questions 8, or 12-17 of section IV, NGB Form 34-1, or have not completed Initial entry training (IET) are ineligible to apply. DD214(s) that have unfavorable remarks to include; unsatisfactory performance, misconduct, dropped from the rolls (DFR), unsuitability/unfitness or in lieu of court-martial (AR 135-18, AR 135-91 Chapter 4,26, AR 135-178 Chapter 8,3 and 635-200 Chapter 11) are also ineligible to apply.
 11. Individuals selected for AGR tours that cannot obtain 20 years of Active Federal Service prior to reaching mandatory separation, must complete a statement of understanding acknowledging this fact. Waiver authority rests with the Human Resource Officer for non-control graded positions and with National Guard Bureau (NGB) for control Graded positions.
 12. The Arizona National Guard, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to pursue waivers, when applicable, IAW AR 135-18, Table 2-2.

BRIEF JOB DESCRIPTION:

Actively works personnel requests and functions associated with Soldier's pay, orders, awards, schools, and medical readiness utilizing various administrative and training data base systems such as: MUP, DAMPS, IPPS-A, FMSWeb, ATRRS, AFAM, MEDPROS. The RNCO also advises the commander on training and unit mobilization readiness requirements. Advises the commander on the following: Aircraft maintenance, operational readiness of vehicles and ground equipment, vehicle load plans, unit movement plans, convoy clearance requests, preparation of IDT and Annual Training, and assists the Commander to develop near-term, short range and long-range training plans IAW BN Yearly Training Guidance (YTG). Reviews operation orders, training schedules, and publishes information to the unit. Obtains all required data for the unit's status report and assists the commander in preparing readiness reports as prescribed in AR 220-1. Accountability of equipment is the primary logistics function that the Readiness NCO will oversee. Supervises the duties performed by the unit's full-time Supply NCO; maintaining property accountability, ensuring all required equipment is on hand or on valid requisition, scheduling all required inventories, as well as audits and reconciliation. Assumes the duties and responsibilities of the Unit Supply Sergeant in the absence of a Unit Supply representative. Will become familiar and have assigned roles/functions in GCSS-A. Works directly with the commander in monitoring the recruiting and retention activities of the unit. Is directly involved in the maintenance of strength and personnel readiness issues of the unit including family programs. Performs other duties as assigned.
